That means you must pay an £89 (INR 8,361) one-time registration fee and a £116 (INR 10,898) annual subscription fee. You must pay both the £89 and £116 fees in your first year. Every year after that, you only need to pay the £116 annual subscription fee, which is due on January 1st. Even if you are not taking any exams that year, you must pay this fee. If you do not, you may be removed from the student register and required to re-register as a student for £89 in order to continue your studies. Further, they should have 65% marks in a minimum of two subjects and more than 50% marks in the rest of the three subjects.Those who have graduated with any commerce degree such as BBA, B.Com, BMS, etc. However, BA or BSc graduates are also eligible given that they have a foundational knowledge of Accountancy.Those who are preparing for CPT or CA IPCC exams can also apply for ACCA exams if you have completed the CA course and want to gain global accreditation, you are also eligible.
