To get results from Google each time you search, you can make Google your default search engine. For example, instead of my head hurts, say headache, because thats the term a medical site uses. Tip 4: Do not worry about the little things Spelling: Google's spell checker uses the most common spelling of a given word, regardless of how you spell it. Capitalization: A search for New York Times is the same as a search for new york times. Tip 5: Find quick answers For many searches, Google provides answers directly in the search results. Some features, such as details about sports teams, aren't available in all regions. Weather: Search weather to find the weather in your location or add a city name, like weather seattle, to find weather for a certain place. Dictionary: Put define in front of any word to find its definition. Calculations: Enter a math equation such as 3\*9123, or solve complex graphing equations. Unit conversions: Enter any conversion, such as 3 dollars in euros. Sports: To find a schedule, game scores, and more, search for the name of your team. Quick facts: Search for the name of a celebrity, location, movie, or song to find related info. Post to the help community Get answers from community members If a network you use, including VPN networks, seems to be sending automated traffic to Google Search, you might get the message Our systems have detected unusual traffic from your computer network. What to do when you get this message The message most likely shows a reCAPTCHA. To confirm that you're a person and not a robot, solve the reCAPTCHA. After you solve it, the message goes away, and you can use Google again. If you don't get a reCAPTCHA, check if: Your browser is supported by reCAPTCHA JavaScript is enabled Learn how to solve a reCAPTCHA. What to do if you continue to get the message Here's what you can do if you continue to get the "Unusual traffic from your computer network" message: Learn how to detect and remove malware. You or another user on your network might have malware, which is malicious software that can be installed on your computer without your knowledge. Some malware can cause Google to show this message. Contact your network administrator or IT professional to help you locate the source and stop the problem. You could get this message if others that use the same network you use, like at a school or business, are sending automated searches to Google. Uninstall the VPN from your computer or network, or contact your VPN provider. You could get this message if others that use the same Virtual Private Network (VPN) you use are sending automated searches to Google. This can also happen with IPv6 tunnel services. Some VPNs and tunnel services cause all traffic to be blocked because they make it impossible for Google to tell the difference between abusive and non-abusive traffic. Contact your internet provider about the error. You could get this message if others that use the same internet provider you use are sending automated searches to Google. What to do if you're a network administrator or provider If you administer a network or are an internet service or VPN provider, locate the sources of automated traffic to Google and block them. Once the automated searches have stopped, your users should be able to search normally on Google. Network administrators or others should thoroughly review before they buy IP space from an IP broker. If possible, ask to test the network first to make sure it can access major websites and doesn't have any existing blocks on it. Advanced search Google offers pages designed to help you perform specialized web and image searches: Google Advanced Search Google Advanced Image Search Filters & topics After you perform a search, filter and topic buttons appear near the search bar. They may also appear in other places on the page. Filters Filters allow you to narrow results to a particular type, such as: The "Web" filter contains text-based links to websites. The exact filters and the order in which they appear is dynamic. It's based on what our systems might think are most helpful to your query. If you don't find a particular filter that you want, use the "All" option to check others that are available. Topics Topics allow you to add terms to your query that can help you get more specific information or explore related information. Relevant topics for a query are automatically generated and displayed. They're based on what our systems understand about how people search and how content is analyzed across the web. Topics are available on computers for most countries or regions, and they'll expand to more countries or regions and languages on mobile. Operators To narrow your results in specific ways, you can use special operators in your search. Do not put spaces between the operator and your search term. A search for [site:nytimes.com] will work, but [site: nytimes.com] won't. Here are some popular operators: Search for an exact match: Enter a word or phrase inside quotes. For example, [tallest building]. Go to our blogpost for more information about how to search using quotes. Search for a specific site: Enter site: in front of a site or domain. For example, [site:youtube.com cat videos]. Exclude words from your search: Enter - in front of a word that you want to leave out. For example, [jaguar speed -car]. Related results After you click a web result and return back to the search results, you may find more related results added to what was originally generated. These added results are related to the web result that you clicked on. Related searches After a search, you find related searches to what you originally searched for. Related searches are automatically generated based on what our systems understand about how people search. Settings In Google Search, you can use settings that allow you to match or remove certain types of content: Related resources
