However, note that submitting proof of your relationship early on may help the consulate with their preliminary review. 1. Provide copies of boarding passes, train itineraries, hotel receipts, passport stamps (make sure to read the dates), and other evidence of meeting within the last two years. Highlight or add post-it notes for easier reading. 2. Include color photos of you and your fiance together. Write your names, date, and location on the back of each photo. Provide 2-5 photos; make a copy if it's digital. 3. For items that don't show proof of meeting in the last two years, provide written documentation such as phone bills, letters, emails with stamps, and other documents. Two to four of each type are acceptable. You need to send several documents to your fiancé before the interview, including proof of information you submitted when the petition was filed and any evidence of requested evidence for a Record of Employment (RFE). This information should be reviewed by your fiancé in advance of the interview. You also need to provide copies of documentary proof submitted with I-129F. Your fiancé needs to have this information ready for their interview at the embassy, which will also have its own set of documents. 3. Send an original letter confirming your intention to marry your fiancé and supporting the K-1 Visa. This letter should be signed and dated, similar to the one provided with I-129F. You also need to provide proof of financial support through an I-134 Affidavit of Support form. This needs to be completed and signed, along with any necessary supporting evidence. You should begin gathering required information ahead of time as it can take several weeks to collect everything. To complete this form, you'll need documents such as: A bank statement or a letter from your employer on company stationery Information about your employment, including salary and whether the position is temporary or permanent If self-employed, proof of income tax returns or business financial information Bonds serial numbers and denominations Once you receive your NOA2, start collecting these documents as soon as possible. Keep a backup copy for yourself since the embassy will also have copies. You'll need to bring evidence of your ongoing relationship to the interview, including photos, travel documents, emails, chat logs, and other written documentation from between the time the petition was filed and now. After receiving the K-1 visa packet from USCIS, it is essential to review and understand the contents carefully. This includes documents such as the NOA2, DS-160 confirmation number, medical examination instructions, and evidence of relationship between the foreign-citizen fiancé(e) and the U.S. citizen sponsor. Proper preparation for the K-1 visa interview can greatly facilitate the process. Upon arrival in the United States on a K-1 visa, the foreign-citizen fiancé(e) must get married to their U.S. citizen sponsor within 90 days. Failure to do so will result in being required to leave the country. The K-1 visa holder is considered a non-immigrant and cannot obtain an extension of the 90-day time limit. After marriage, the foreign-citizen can apply for permanent residence through Adjustment of Status (AOS) or by leaving the U.S. and re-entering on a new visa. However, if they leave the country before marrying their sponsor, re-entry might not be permitted without a new visa. In such cases, it is crucial to have applied for Advance Parole to avoid difficulties with re-entry. Please note that K-1 visa holders receive "green card" and conditional permanent residence status, which lasts for two years. They must file an AOS application within the specified timeframe to obtain full permanent resident status.
