Roman Abramovich does not speak English He was named by Forbes as the 120 richest person in the world. The main owner of Millhouse LLC (a private investment company registered in 2001) has donated more money to charity than any other living Russian. Between 1999 and 2013, it donated more than \$2.5 billion to worthy causes. Billions have been donated to build hospitals, schools and infrastructure in Chukotka, Russia's remote and impoverished region, where he served as governor from 2000 to 2008. Politician of 1999, in 2003 he was awarded the Order of Honour by Russian President Vladimir Putin for his "huge contribution" to the economic development of the region. Abramovich was born in Saratov, Soviet Union, in October 1966. Orphaned after his mother, Irina, a housekeeper, died when he was only 18 months old, and his father, Arkady, a manager of the state office, died in an accident when the young man was only four years old, was raised by relatives, spending much of his life in the RepA© Komi oblique. His father's uncle, Leib, took Abramovich to the industrial city of Ukhta, where he attended the local public school. He realized the value of money from a young age, probably as a result of his education. He first entered the business world while attending Ukhta Technical University, selling used tires and car parts from his apartment to earn extra money. Later, he attended the Gubkin Institute of Oil and Gas in Moscow, before beginning his compulsory military service in 1974. Entrepreneurial Spirit While in the army, he didn't think a military career was for him, so he used his insight to sell gas to officers as an advantage. This allowed him to To save money for your future companies, the first of which was Comfort Co-op, selling imported products Toys. It was a great success and he used the profits to launch his first oil business, in the Omsk district. He became friends with businessman Boris Berezovsky, who opened the doors to Abramovich. Berezovsky had close ties with former president Boris Yeltsin, so Abramovich was invited to important events and dinners. He even got an apartment in the Kremlin. It branched out and founded several diverse businesses, including petroleum products, pig farms, bodyguard recruitment, sugar, lumber and food products. His entrepreneurial spirit allowed him to forge a lucrative career as an entrepreneur, even in a country where it was not easy to make a fortune. Accumulating Wealth It wasn't all about sailing for Abramovich and before he became one of the richest people on the planet, he faced difficult times. In particular, its Swiss-based trading company, Runicom, went bankrupt in 2003 and reportedly had to repay a loan to the European Bank for Reconstruction and Development. Already a great actor in the highest circles, thanks to his political and business ties, was able to weather the storm, and when the industrial assets of the Soviet Union were divided, Abramovich was on the road to earning his first billion. It had acquired the large oil company, Sibneft, as a result of Russia's controversial equity lending program. President Yeltsin privatized Sibneft and Abramovich and Berezovsky were able to buy the business for only \$100 million, much cheaper than its market value of \$600 million. This was the basis of his great wealth, as he went on to sell his shares in Sibneft for an estimated £1.8 billion. Chelsea FC expanded its business empire with the purchase of Chelsea Football Club in June 2003, where it immediately embarked on an ambitious business development program, with the aim of making Chelsea a global brand, like the Royal Football Dynasties and Manchester United. Since he took over, the club has won 13 large big Including the Premier League Five Times, the UEFA Champions League and the UEFA Europa League twice. He has established a charity called the pole of hope to continue helping the people of Chukotka. In June 2019, he personally donated \$5 million to the non-profit group, the Jewish agency for Israel, to combat anti-Semitism globally. The self-made billionaire has bought his own fleet of luxury yachts, nicknamed "ã ~ Åmamovich Navyã" by the media, including the 162.5-meter eclipse. It also owns a Private Boeing 767-33A/ER aircraft, known as Bandit.
